Pastor Josh's Desert Wisdom

Maybe you have noticed that the season of Lent brings with it plenty of desert and wilderness imagery. A couple weeks ago I decided to find out what the fuss was about! I went to Scottsdale, Arizona, for part two of the training from the Interim Ministry Network. IMN is an ecumenical and interfaith organization of 1200 members that has been training clergy, administrators, and lay leaders in the United States and Canada for over three decades. The training provides "contemporary education and training to help them avoid or reduce the severity of unhealthy practices, manage the effects of change and restore spiritual wellness where it has been lost" (From IMNedu.org). The first part of my training was in Connecticut last June and focused on individual leadership and the second focused on interaction with a community in transition.

While I was serving as the visiting pastor at Holden Village in the summer of 2017, I met an interim minister who was one of the trainers for IMN and he helped me see the possibilities of interim ministry and also the importance of receiving good training for this unique work. When I agreed to take the call at Mount Zion I requested that IMN training be a part of my preparation and support for this unique calling.

The best practices, tools, and models that were part of my first training formed the inspiration for much of my leadership and content for many of my forums and the Leadership Board Retreat I led in September—which set up the work of transition. The second part of the training helped me process my experience at Mount Zion and learn more from it to be a better interim leader.

The content, especially regarding theories of change and different leadership styles in conflict and transition, was very helpful in understanding some of my past and current experiences at Mount Zion. These IMN sessions filled in many of the gaps of seminary education, and I wish every seminarian could take them, but they are especially helpful in helping form leaders who honor change and help communities get the most out of times of transition.

Paul and the Bright Light **March 10th - March 31st**

After Jesus had died, Saul zealously began to persecute the followers of Jesus. Saul was full of head knowledge and Pharisaical law, and Saul could not/would not believe in Jesus. Saul thought he was actually doing God's will. Suddenly, everything changed for Saul on the road to Damascus when a bright light blinded Saul and Jesus spoke to him. "Why are you persecuting me?" Saul's life was dramatically changed. The main focus for this rotation is to see the dramatic change and turnaround in Saul's life. This lesson shows how God can forgive the most heinous sins and transform people with His amazing grace for His purpose. Paul's encounter with Christ transformed his entire understanding of "religion". Instead of thinking we are saved by religious rules and practices, Paul repeatedly spoke out about God's grace and love, forgiveness and tolerance. One of the experiences that I appreciated most was working with small groups, made up of pastors from various denominations, as we applied the tools and practices we were learning to case studies from our communities. I especially loved talking to a pastor who was the first woman pastor of George Washington's home congregation near Mount Vernon, Virginia. We saw many similarities in our calls, and had great conversations about how we see the founders of the United States and Christianity. We sometimes make them seem as static and stoic as the stone and metal they are carved in, when they were actually young leaders who had dynamic ideas and took big risks, just like Jesus and his disciples.

There are so many lessons to be learned from the early church, and our cultural heritage to inspire us to adapt and grow through times of change. I've been honored to walk with the people of Mount Zion through the tensions, challenges, and joys of interim ministry. I look forward to continuing to learn and churn through the wilderness of our transition, knowing that God is with us to nourish us through times of change.

Holy Week

It's already time to start looking ahead to plans for Holy Week. Will you join us?

Sunday April 14: The 8:30 and 10:45 Palm Sunday worship services traditionally start with a palm-waving procession as we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We'll also celebrate First Communion for our 2nd and 3rd graders at the 8:30 service.

Wednesday, April 17: No evening worship.

Thursday, April 18: A quiet Maundy Thursday worship service occurs at 6:30pm and includes stripping the altar to remember the trial of Jesus.

Friday, April 19: Your choice of Good Friday worship services at 12:15pm and 6:30pm, which end in silence and darkness, as Jesus' light went out of the world.

Additionally, we will join our Partners in Faith at Reformation Lutheran for a **Good Friday Neighborhood Walk**. Similar to the Stations of the Cross, the group will stop at sites in Reformation's Holy Ground that demonstrate signs of despair and transformation. Scripture will be read, and our group will sing and pray together, uplifting the symbol of the cross in the heart of the city. Monticello, by Sally Cabot Gunning

After the death of her beloved mother, Martha Jefferson spent five years abroad with her father, Thomas Jefferson, on his first diplomatic mission to France. Now, at seventeen, Jefferson's bright, handsome eldest daughter is returning to the lush hills of the family's beloved Virginia plantation, Monticello. Martha has changed and the world around her has also become far more complicated than it once seemed. The doting father she idolized since childhood has begun to pull away. Moving back into political life, he has become distracted by the tumultuous fight for power and troubling new attachments. The home she adores depends on slavery, a practice Martha abhors. But Monticello is burdened by debt, and it cannot survive without the labor of her family's slaves. As her life becomes constrained by the demands of marriage, motherhood, politics, scandal, and her family's increasing impoverishment, Martha yearns to find her way back to the gentle beauty and quiet happiness of the world she once knew at the top of her father's "little mountain."



Upcoming commemorations

Sunday, March 31 — John Donne, poet, died 1631

After finishing his education at Oxford University, Donne seemed headed for a career in the English public service. But a series of circumstances led him into the ordained ministry. He is well known as a writer of both secular and sacred poetry.

Thursday, April 4 — Benedict the African, confessor, died 1589

Born a slave on the island of Sicily, Benedict lived as a hermit until the pope ordered all hermits to attach themselves to a monastery, at which time Benedict joined the Franciscans. Though illiterate, he was highly respected as a confessor and later superior of his community.

Saturday, April 6 — Albrecht Dürer, died 1528; Matthias Grünewald, died 1529; Lucas Cranach, died 1553; artists

These great artists revealed through their work the mystery of salvation and the wonder of creation. Dürer's work reflected the apocalyptic spirit of his time. Though he remained a Roman Catholic, he was sympathetic to Martin Luther's reforming work. Grünewald's paintings are known for their dramatic forms, vivid colors, and depiction of light. Cranach's work includes many fine religious examples and several portraits of Martin Luther. Cranach was also widely known for his woodcuts.
